Dear All,

On 25 May, our meeting will be dedicated to a workshop on Animal Welfare during transport, in collaboration with the Policy Department for Structural and Cohesion policies.

The workshop will see the participation of four experts:

two independent experts and two from research institutes. The experts will present their reports, which are focussing on specific welfare needs for certain categories of animals, as well as on sea transport and good practices found in third countries.

On 31 May, our Committee meeting will hold its 6th public hearing on "Transport of certain species (poultry, rabbits) inadequately covered by Regulation 1/2005 and remaining vulnerable categories of animals (gestating, end-of-production animals)" with presentations from 5 experts: Ms Julia Havenstein, Representative of the NGO Animals' Angels on transport of end-of career animals or gestating animals; Drs. Kitty de Vries Representative of Caring Vets, Netherlands, on transport of end-of career animals or gestating animals; Ms Birthe Steenberg, Secretary General of AVEC (EU Poultry organisation-Industry) on transport of poultry; Ms Brigitte Gothière, director of the NGO L214, on transport of rabbits and poultry; Mr Yann Nédélec, Director of the Confédération Française de l'Aviculture (EU farmers' organisation) on transport of rabbits.

- Ms Rossella Delfino (Head of Unit A2, Legal affairs) who supported the other two colleagues and gave her insight on questions related to infringement procedures.

- "Particular welfare needs in animal transport: aquatic animals", by Mr Doug Waley (independent expert);

While the second presentations will focus on:

- "Welfare on sea vessels and criteria for approval of vessel authorisation", by Ms Maria Boada-Saña (independent expert) and Ms Katarzyna Kulikowska;
- "The practices of animal welfare during transport in the third countries" by Prof Michael Marahrens (Friedrich-Loeffler Institut FLI, Germany).
